# Multispecies Marxism: Reading and Reflecting on *Animals and Capital*

Marxist Education Project
Winter 2024

A discussion and reading group, led by anthropologist Gizem Haspolat and visual artist Terike Haapoja, on the central role of nonhuman animals in the capitalist economy, historically and today. The class continues the 2022 and 2023 sessions, this time focusing on key concepts of Marxism, such as 'value,' 'primitive accumulation,' 'species being,' 'circulation,' or 'resistance,' through a multispecies lens. We will explore the potential and limits of Marxist theory for addressing the roles and fates of nonhuman animals, as well as ways to connect anticapitalist struggles to animal liberation and environmental justice. The main reading for this study group will be <a href="Animals and Capital">Animals and Capital</a> (2023) by Dinesh Joseph Wadiwel. The book is available in paperback and eBook formats from various online outlets. Other readings will be available online or in PDFs in the group's Dropbox folder. (Participation in the 2022 or 2023 classes is not required.)

**Gizem Haspolat** is a PhD candidate in Anthropology at Rice University. Her areas of interest are critical animal studies, animal geographies, and human–nonhuman animal relations. In her ongoing research, she explores live animal trade as a site that intensifies the translations between 'animal' and capital, through an investigation of Turkey's live cattle imports.

**Terike Haapoja** is a visual artist based in Berlin. Her interdisciplinary practice includes installations, videos, writings, and collaborative projects that explore our relationship with the more-than-human world.
